We intercede for preachers and ministers of the Gospel in every church in this land. For them we seek ongoing anointing, so that they may make plain the Word of God for the present situation. May bishops, ministers, stewards, class leaders, Sunday school teachers, youth leaders be committed to the task. Inspire the church with prophets who will devise the ways and means whereby the new normal that is with us might be creatively dealt with.

Convict with the power of the Gospel those in our midst who delight in breaking the law, to the detriment of human lives. Stay the hand of those intent upon using the knife and the gun to inflict pain on others. May we in this land we love witness a lessening of crime and violence, that we may breathe air that is physically and spiritually pure.

Visit with Your love the sick, sad and lonely. Comfort those who mourn the loss of loved ones. May the peace which we associate at this time of the year be at the background of all that will take place during this year's Advent and Christmas.
